actually smaller
than a pigeon.
They weigh 125-185
grams, and stand
19-20 cm high. They
have brown bodies
mottled with white.
Their coloring acts
as camouflage in
the grasslands
where they live.

WHAT DO THE OWLETS LOOK LIKE?

Baby Owlets look a lot like the adults. However, they have throats that are more rusty colored, and breasts that are buff colored. When they become adults, they get their adult plumage.

WHERE DO THEY LIVE?

Burrowing Owls in holes in the ground and trees. They are commonly found in open areas like forests and deserts, and can be found in South America, Western Canada, and Mexico. They can also be found in Brazil, Patagonia, Florida, and the Caribbean.

The main predators of Burrowing Owls are badgers, jungle cats, wild dogs, coyotes, and snakes.
